Fort Lauderdale Ocean Rescue Lieutenant Mitch P. McCrady has sixteen years of service for the City of Fort Lauderdale as an ocean lifeguard acting in a part-time and full-time capacity as both a lifeguard and lieutenant. Mitchell started with Fort Lauderdale Ocean Rescue in 1989, worked until 1994, and left to pursue his education. He returned to the beach patrol in 2002, and was promoted to lieutenant in 2012. Lt. McCrady also works for Pompano Beach Ocean Rescue, and has been there since 2001.

- Lt. McCrady has been very active with the USLA SER, and Fort Lauderdale Chapter. He not only trains all the new Fort Lauderdale Ocean Rescue (FLOR) lifeguards, but coordinates and instructs at lifesaving academies all over the region, country, and abroad (Argentina). This year he was the lead instructor for the lifesaving academy held at Hallandale Beach and also was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant at FLOR.
- Lt. McCrady is a very accomplished athlete. The following are just a few of the most recent accomplishments: National Champion Open Surfboat 2009, National Champion Age Group American Ironman 2007, 2009, National Champion Age Group Surfboat 2007,2009.
- Lt. McCrady is the consummate professional in every aspect of his job performance making him an ambassador for not just Fort Lauderdale but the noble profession of ocean lifesaving. In a time where the other public safety occupations get most of the public's attention, Mitchell wears a banner for ocean lifeguards everywhere. He is never afraid to speak his mind when standing up for his profession or issues he feels are important. Mitchell lives the motto "Lifeguard for Life"

#### **BEACH PATROL OF THE YEAR - 2012**

#### St. John's County, Ocean Rescue

Nominees: Okaloosa County / Palm Beach County / Pompano Beach

The **St. Johns County Fire Rescue (SJCFR) Marine Rescue Division** is responsible for all aquatic related emergencies occurring in St. Johns County. This includes 42 miles of coastline, the intercoastal waterway and the St. Johns River. The primary objective of this first response service is to provide the highest level of skilled and efficient response to all people or situations requiring any aquatic or marine intervention.

The seasonal lifeguard service provided by St. Johns County Fire Rescue established in 1933 maintains 21 lifeguard towers and seven vehicle patrols daily. These positions are staffed with 60 seasonal lifeguards comprised of: Zone Supervisors, Driver Operators and Tower Lifeguards. Personnel and apparatus maintain coverage each day from the hours of 10am-6pm from Memorial Day – Labor Day. For the remainder of the year, the Marine Rescue Division is staffed with 4 full-time Fire Rescue Officers supplemented by trained Fire Rescue Responders located at strategically oriented Fire Stations throughout St. Johns County.

During the past several years, SJCFR Marine Rescue Division has developed a cutting edge Marine Rescue Operations Plan. This program has been formatted based on the requirements of The National Fire Protections Agency (NFPA) 1670 requirements and the standard USLA Open Water Lifeguard Certification. To date over 100 certified firefighters have achieved Operations, Technician or Specialist level certifications for completing this rigorous training.

With the development of this program SJCFR has been contacted by numerous surrounding agencies with requests to teach and assist in developing similar programs in both combined Fire Rescue Departments and also in Lifeguard only agencies. Our goal in teaching this program to surrounding agencies is to create a unified response to water rescue type emergencies for the Northeast FL region. The 1670 program was designed to work for all levels of water rescue response, from the basic Operations responder all the way to the advanced Specialist responder. Utilizing the framework developed by the USLA and the NFPA we have developed a program that can be tailored to each Departments needs and allow water safety to be emphasized across the region. As this program continues to evolve we hope to share this tool with other agencies outside the Northeast FL area in our continuing effort to enhance training and education in the aquatic environment.

#### PRESIDENTS AWARD for OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS TO OCEAN LIFESAVING RECIPIENT: USLA Training Academy / Hallandale Beach Ocean Rescue

On September 7th, 2012, members of the USLA Southeast Region were called to assist the City of Hallandale Beach in the hiring / training of a future ocean rescue lifeguard agency. Of the eightnine people that passed the lifeguard test, sixteen were invited to the 40 hour USLA course. Academy Instructors, Joe Taylor, Mitch McCrady, Ken Sullivan, Ryan Kooser, Joe McManus, and Casey Coote, all graduates of the USLA Southeast Regional Training Officer Academy, made the commitment to instruct this class of rookie ocean rescue lifeguards. These six dedicated individuals made it possible for Hallandale Beach Ocean Rescue to get trained open water lifeguards ready for work very quickly.

#### F.B.P.C.A. LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

**RECIPIENT: Kevin Sweat** 

Volusia County Department of Public Protection, Beach Safety Division Director Kevin Sweat was born in Volusia County and first joined the Beach Patrol in 1978 at the age of 16. He accepted a full time position in 1982 and ascended to the top of an agency that makes about 3,000 ocean rescues each year, often more than every other lifeguard agency in Florida combined. Volusia's Beach Patrol is also one of the few agencies in the country that blends lifesaving and lawenforcement duties - its officers, while trained to swim out and save distressed swimmers, also carry guns and have full arrest powers. During his tenure, Volusia County was the host Agency for Rescue 2002 World Lifesaving Championships, he served as a USLA National Vice-President and was the USLA National Team Manager for Rescue 2006 in Gelong, Australia and 2008 Berlin, Germany. Kevin earned a Master's degree in Public Administration from the University of Central Florida. Kevin served the Volusia County Beach Patrol for 34 years and retired in 2012.
